PERSONNEL MANAGEMENT, RELATIONS:

- 2) Four of our current Firefighters are planning on attending the Medic One EMT School: Cassidy Stevick, Tom Williams, Anthony Clinton and Kelsey Cavill; one of our current EMTs, Marion Curry, is planning on attending the Thurston County Firefighter Recruit Academy. *Thanks to you all for your continued commitment to serve!!*

EQUIPMENT & FACILITIES:

1) Apparatus & Equipment:

- a. Engine 81 was seen by Cummins Northwest for engine issues (reported last month); also as follow-up repairs, seat-backs, air-line (brake), ladder supports and compartment indicator lights have been repaired. Work pending includes engine-compression brake and windshield wipers.
- b. Engine 82 is out of service for radiator repairs.
- c. Aid Unit 81 shopped during the month for oil leak and had Knoxbox lock installed. Battalion 82 unit also had a Knoxbox lock installed.
- d. Personal protective equipment (PPE, i.e. helmet, coat, pants, boost, etc.) field decontamination kits have been installed on Engines 81 and 83. This is part of the ongoing effort to implement District Health & Safety PPE Program procedures.

2) Facilities:

- a. On June 1st, staff met with Sunset Air regarding the automated controls for the HVAC system at Station 8-1 to provide training and discuss issues with temperature variations; Lt Hall will be the interim lead coordinator for system controls.
- b. Chief VanCamp and Lt Hall began touring all District facilities during the month to inspect them and determine backlog of maintenance and capital projects. This information will also be used in upcoming facilities planning efforts.
- c. At their regular meeting on June 13th, the Board approved a final payment to the District Training Center contractor OSG; in May, the District and OSG engaged in mediation on the issue of close-out claims.
- d. Station 8-1:
 - i. The storm-water drainage system failed inspection by Thurston County Resource Stewardship, and is being addressed with culvert/pipe cleaning by contractor.
 - ii. Dead shrubbery was removed from the yard area.
 - iii. Thurston County Roads Department has been contacted about trimming the grass and brush along South Bay Road north of the driveway to improve sight distance.
 - iv. Septic tank covers were replaced.
- e. Station 8-3:
 - i. The PPE decontamination sink plumbing is almost complete;
 - ii. The underground water-pipe to the Annex and the sprinkler system reservoirs requires additional repair work. Lt Hall is developing a scope of work and estimate of work.
 - iii. The fire alarm system monitoring was changed to Custom Alarm, the same as all other District facilities.
 - iv. Septic tank covers were replaced.
- f. Chief McBride and Lt Hall are working on developing a scope of work and estimate for surface treatment and striping of Station 8-1, 8-2 and 8-3 parking lot areas.

- d. Ategan is working with Secretary Stumpf in preparing an IT inventory for the District Capital Repairs & Replacement Plan Schedule &
