PLANNING SERVICES:

- 1) Chief VanCamp and the Thurston County Association of Fire Chiefs hosted a day-long workshop on new Washington Survey & Rating Bureau public protection classification grading procedures on June 27th. County fire chiefs will be working together to help plan for near-future inspections of each fire department.

PUBLIC RELATIONS & COMMUNITY SERVICES:

- 1) As part of the FD7-FD8 integration planning effort, two Interim Citizen Advisory Committee workshops were held on June 6th and 13th. Approximately four dozen citizens from both districts participated in a process facilitated by Skip Houser. The primary objectives for the workshop included providing information, discussion regarding the integration plan and encouraging input, comments and suggestions. Approximately three-quarters of the citizens strongly supported the integration plan (there were no citizens that strongly dis-agreed). A final report was issued on June 20th, with continued ongoing efforts to communicate with all stakeholders.

- 3) The first ever joint FD7 and FD8 Safety Committee meeting was held on June 3rd at Station 7-1. Thanks to Captain Longmire for organizing and leading that effort.
- 4) Chief LeMay and FD8 in partnership with the State Fire Marshal's Office and the National Fire Academy hosted a certified Incident Safety Officer training session at Station 8-1 on June 15th and 16th. Thirty fire service members (include 8 from FD8) participated.
- 5) Entry testing and oral interviews for new recruits were conducted on June 27th and 28th; there were 18 applicants, of which twelve candidates were tested.

PERSONNEL MANAGEMENT, RELATIONS:

- 1) The joint Thurston County Recruit Academy and Medic One EMT Class graduation ceremony was held on June 27th at the Olympia HS auditorium. Three new firefighters were graduated: Brent Collins, Ryan Ikerd and Daniel Parine. One new EMT graduated, current FD8 Firefighter Adam Walker. Congratulations all!

EQUIPMENT & FACILITIES:

- 1) Apparatus & Equipment:
 - a. New batteries were purchased and installed in Engine 822. The truck is ready for Lake Fair.
 - b. The Ford Expedition had a new window motor installed in the front passenger side, the oil changed and the transmission was serviced.
 - c. The 2010 Tahoe had body work done to the back bumper and the right side tail light.
 - d. R-81 had new mirrors installed, floor mats and the front end was checked out.
 - e. New mattresses were delivered for the beds at Station 8-1.
- 2) Facilities:
 - a. The Boy Scouts have completed their move to Station 8-3 and appear to be very happy with the facility.

- b. Clean-up of all facilities is complete per request from Chief VanCamp.
- c. Sunset Air continues to gather information for the ESCO audit.
