

# DISTRICT MONTHLY REPORT: AUGUST 2017

## ADMINISTRATIVE:

- 1) At the August 8<sup>th</sup> Board meeting, an update for District *Policy 1-22 "Information Technology & Media"* and a new *District Policy 3-30 "Member Performance Evaluations"* were approved. The second policy enables the implementation of the District performance development and planning process, a critical element of the strategic staffing plan.

## PLANNING SERVICES:

- 1) At their regular meeting held on August 8<sup>th</sup>, the Board reviewed a *District Master Plan Overview* document prepared by Chief VanCamp that outlined his vision of future operational and capital arrangements. He explained that it is an attempt to provoke discussion while helping to place the current strategic planning work into context of further planning that needs to be accomplished.
- 2) recommendation to conduct a comprehensive assessment and valuation of all District facilities in order to obtain critical life expectancy, maintenance and financial information for future planning and updating the District's Capital Repairs & Replacement Schedule & Budget. Based upon the reception of the idea, an alternative and more modest means of accomplishing this will be explored.
- 3) Chief VanCamp participated in county-wide discussions of coordinated response to large scale incidents within Thurston County on August 30<sup>th</sup>. Sponsored by the Thurston County Fire Chiefs' Association, it was part of ongoing effort to bring clarity and process to the continuum of incident complexity from a single company response to disaster-level mobilization events.

## PUBLIC RELATIONS & COMMUNITY SERVICES:

- 1) On August 15<sup>th</sup>, concurrent with the monthly Thurston County Fire Commissioners' Association meeting, the District sponsored



a demonstration of Airlift Northwest's helicopter landing process. Thanks to Brenda Nelson of Airlift Northwest for coordinating their visit!

- 2) On August 19<sup>th</sup>, the District help support the annual *Run Like a Dog* event sponsored by the South Bay Veterinary Hospital.
- 3) Chief VanCamp met with representatives of the Boston Harbor Association, the Boston Harbor Public Works Advisory Committee and Thurston County Public Works staff to discuss recent concerns about the Boston Harbor fire hydrant system and its use. Chief VanCamp was able to answer questions about the system and its use at a recent structure fire.

**EMERGENCY RESPONSE (Cont.):** On August 22<sup>nd</sup>, a brush fire erupted near the Scatter Creek Wildlife Refuge area, and escalated to one of the largest fires in Thurston County history. The District provided two engine companies and two tenders to the effort, the crews working a full 12-hour shift at the scene before being relieved by resources mobilized from out of the county. Chief LeMay, as duty officer, placed a call-back and the District staffed both Station 8-1 and 8-3 until the mutual aid units returned.

- 2) Chiefs VanCamp and LeMay met with Annalee Drury from Thurston County Medic One on August 23<sup>rd</sup> about several issues regarding primary EMT training. Chief LeMay, at the request of Chief VanCamp, also developed a list of alternative plans for EMT initial training; these options were review and evaluated for cost benefit and reasonability for volunteers.
- 3) Pilot training for the Performance Development & Planning (PDP) for Expectations process was held on August 24<sup>th</sup> for District senior staff; the first phase of the program will begin next month.
- 4) Secretary Stumpf conducted District procurement policy and procedural training for staff on August 25<sup>th</sup>.

### **PERSONNEL MANAGEMENT, RELATIONS:**

- 1) On August 9<sup>th</sup>, an IR&R Integrated Decision Making Team (IDMT) meeting was held to evaluate District wildland firefighting policy and training.
- 2) The annual South Bay Firefighters' Association picnic was held at Burfoot County Park on August 12<sup>th</sup> with excellent food, beverages, games and comradery for all. Thanks to Diana Estrada and Brandon LeMay for helping to coordinate the event!

### **EQUIPMENT & FACILITIES:**

- 1) Apparatus & Equipment:
  - a. Annual hose and ladder testing was conducted during the month by National Hose Testing; 16,269 feet of host and 12 ladders were tested, with only 4 sections of hose failing and requiring repair or replacement.
  - b. Aid Unit 83 was serviced for a battery charging issue.
  - c. Engine 83 received a replacement mobile data terminal as part of the fleet upgrades.

2) Facilities:

- a. At the August 8<sup>th</sup> Board meeting, Ryan Pantier of Sunset Air presented the annual report on the performance of energy savings measures and solar-panel electrical generation at Station 8-1. He reported that performance is above estimated figures. The next annual report will be provided much sooner after the annual calculations are provided. He also answered questions regarding solar-panel equipment maintenance & operations and life expectancy.
- b. Chief VanCamp obtained Board approval at the same meeting to obtain design assistance for the repair of a water system supply line behind Station 8-3. In the meantime, temporary repairs have been made and the area of the excavation will be patched.
