

DISTRICT MONTHLY REPORT: JUNE 2018

ADMINISTRATIVE:

- 1) At their regular meeting held on June 12th, the Board adopted Resolution 2018-01 which called for a ballot measure during the November 6th General Election proposing that the District restore its regular property tax levy rate to \$1.50 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation in 2018 for collection in 2019, and, establish an annual growth rate of up to six percent for the following five years. The additional funding is intended to address increased operating costs (primarily labor) to meet staffing requirements.

Phase II Master Plan Report: A summary of the preceding month:

A special Board meeting was held on June 1st to review and approved the summary report of the Master Planning Phase II, “Facilities & Deployment. The report covers project goals & values, historical perspectives on facilities capital planning and factors affecting it, an assessment of the current facilities & deployment situation, identification of future needs, summary of the three primary strategies (“three response stations”, “two response stations” and “two response stations with a central stand-by facility”), the long-term vision for facilities & deployment and specific objectives.

Phase III Master Plan Development: A summary of the preceding month:

To address the master planning phase III areas of interest, Commissioner Harper and Chief VanCamp developed a plan of utilizing the existing District Integrated Decision Making Teams for the related subjects, and assigning a Board member to work with each of the five teams for the duration of the planning work. The five teams are:

- Apparatus & Equipment: with the Facilities & Equipment IDMT and Commissioner Berman;
- Incident Readiness & Response: with the IR&R IDMT and Commissioner Zvirzdys;

- Public Education & Prevention: with a new IDMT for Public Education & Prevention (with Heidi Stumpf as Chair) and Commissioner Gleckler;
- Technology Support: with the Information Technology & Media IDMT and Commissioner Engle; and
- Training & Education: with the Training & Education IDMT and Commissioner Harper.

Scheduling for the committees' meetings is being coordinated by Secretary Stumpf.

PUBLIC RELATIONS & COMMUNITY SERVICES:

- 1) On June 12th, Shift 7 crews commanded by Chief Robinette responded to a reported explosion and fire at 4723 Bellwood Drive NE; the fire was well involved in the separate garage and back bedroom of the home. Shift 7 and Dayshift staff worked with Lacey FD3 and Olympia FD crews to extinguish the fires, which were determined to have been set. Chief VanCamp notified the Thurston County Sheriff's Office, who immediately began a criminal investigation. There were no injuries to responders or civilians.
