Fire Prevention Week October 6-12, 2024

Each year, the National Fire Protection Association, (NFPA) recognized Fire Prevention Week with a different theme. This year's theme, "Smoke alarms: make them work for you!TM" aims to promote the vital role that smoke alarms play in home fire safety, helping ensure that households are adequately protected in the event of a home fire.

Smoke alarms save lives. Properly installed and maintained smoke alarms play a crucial role in reducing fire-related deaths and injuries. Fire spreads quickly—working smoke alarms provide early warnings, giving you the precious time needed to escape safely.

Did you know?

Smoke alarms can cut the risk of dying in a home fire by half.

Installation Tips:

- Install smoke alarms in every bedroom, outside each sleeping area (like hallways), and on every level of your home, including the basement.
- · Ensure smoke alarms meet the needs of all family members, including those with sensory or physical disabilities.

Maintenance Tips:

- · Test smoke alarms at least once a month by pressing the test button.
- Replace smoke alarms every 10 years or if they do not respond when tested.





PROPOSITION 1 NOVEMBER 5TH ELECTION

In 2022, Fire District 8 approved a five-year master plan to enhance community response, including two ballot measures: 1) a 2023 property tax levy restoration to \$1.50 per thousand of assessed valuation, and 2) a 2024 excess levy for an additional \$0.50 per thousand over four years (2025-2028). Voters approved the 2023 levy restoration.

As planned, the excess levy, "Proposition One," was on the August 6, 2024, primary election ballot in Thurston County, requiring a super-majority to pass. This means at least 40%

of the previous general election's voters must participate, and 60% of those must vote "yes." In the 2024 primary, 5,041 voters participated, with 58.3% voting "yes" and 41.7% voting "no," so the measure did not pass.

Following the 2022 plan, the District resubmitted Proposition One for the November 5, 2024, general election.

Emergency medical and fire services impact community health, safety, and homeowner insurance rates. Levy measures allow voters to weigh these benefits against the cost.
